Second Sunday After Epiphany

GOSPEL John 2:1-11 At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the Mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine having run short, the Mother of Jesus said to Him: "They have no wine". And Jesus said to Her: "Woman, what would you have me do? My hour is not yet come". His Mother said to the attendants: "Do whatever He tells you". Now six stone water jars were placed there, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures. Jesus said to them: "Fill the jars with water". And they filled them to the brim. And Jesus said to them: "Draw out now and carry to the chief steward of the feast". And they carried it.

Now when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the attendants knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward called the bridegroom, and said to him: "Every man at first sets forth the good wine: and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but you have kept the good wine until now".

This first of His signs Jesus worked at Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.



St. Agnes of Rome was born in 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after, and she had many high ranking men chasing after her. However, Agnes made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her love for the Lord was great and she hated sin even more than death!

Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse."

According to legend, the young men she turned away became so angry and insulted by her devotion to God and purity that they began to submit her name to authorities as a Christian follower.

At last, she was condemned to death. Even the pagans cried to see such a young and beautiful girl going to death. She did not pay attention to those who begged her to save herself. "I would offend my Spouse," she said, "if I were to try to please you. He chose me first and He shall have me!" Then she prayed and bowed her head for the death-stroke of the sword.

She died a virgin-martyr at the age of 12 or 13 on 21 January 304.

Agnes was buried beside the Via Nomentana in Rome. Her bones are currently conserved beneath the high altar in the church of Sant'Angese fuori le mura in Rome, which was built over the catacomb that held her tomb. Her skull is preserved in the church of Sant'Agnese in Agone in Rome's Piazza Navona.

St. Agnes is widely known as the patron saint of young girls. She is also the patron saint of chastity, rape survivors and the Children of Mary. Agnes is depicted in art with a lamb, from the Latin word for "lamb", agnus, the symbol of her virgin innocence. The name "Agnes" is actually derived from the feminine Greek adjective hagnē meaning "chaste, pure, sacred". She is also shown with a martyr's palm as a young girl in robes holding a palm branch with the lamb either at her feet or in her arms.

Her feast day is celebrated on January 21. She is one of seven women who, along with the Blessed Virgin, are commemorated by name in the Canon of the Mass. On her feast day, it is customary for two lambs to be brought in to be blessed by the pope. On Holy Thursday the lambs' wool is removed and woven into the pallium the pope gives to a newly consecrated archbishop.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

THE PLAN OF SATAN AND HIS MINIONS PART 2

“For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood; but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in high places.”

So teaches St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians, indicating where the real battle lies. Principalities and Powers, yes the demonic ones; but also the human ones infested by Satan, the leaders of Freemasonry who inhabit “high places” in the world system.

Fr. Denis Fahey, in his preface to Msgr. Dillon’s “The War of Antichrist With the Church and Christian Civilization” states:

“The Jewish connection with modern Freemasonry is an established fact everywhere manifested in its history. The Jewish formulas employed by Freemasonry, the Jewish traditions which run through its ceremonial, point to a Jewish origin, or to the work of Jewish contrivers...which impels them to urge “Christians” to persecute the Church and destroy it. With this does there lie a hidden hope to reconstruct their own Temple, and in the darkest depths of plotting, does there lurk a deeper society which still looks to a return to the land of Judah and to the rebuilding the Temple of Jerusalem?”

“To fight against the Papacy is a social necessity and constitutes the constant duty of Freemasons.” (Report of the Masonic International Congress, 1904):

Jouin, 1955, pp.23-24)
