## Sexagesima Sunday

**GOSPEL Luke 8:4-15** At that time, when a very great crowd was gathered together and hastened out of the cities, unto him, he spoke by a similitude. "The sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some fell by the way side. And it was trodden down: and the fowls of the air devoured it. And other seed fell upon a rock. And as soon as it was sprung up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And other seed fell among thorns. And the thorns growing up with it, choked it. And other seed fell upon good ground and, being sprung up, yielded fruit a hundredfold." Saying these things, he cried out: "He that hath ears to hear, let him hear."

And his disciples asked him what this parable might be. To whom he said: "To you it is given to know the mystery of the kingdom of God; but to the rest in parables, that 'seeing they may not see and hearing may not understand.' Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. And they by the way side are they that hear: then the devil cometh and taketh the word out of their heart, lest believing they should be saved. Now they upon the rock are they who when they hear receive the word with joy: and these have no roots: for they believe for a while and in time of temptation they fall away. And that which fell among thorns are they who have heard and, going their way, are choked with the cares and riches and pleasures of this life and yield no fruit. But that on the good ground are they who in a good and perfect heart, hearing the word, keep it and bring forth fruit in patience."



Saint Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows (March 1, 1838 – February 27, 1862)

Born in Assisi, Italy into a large family he was baptized Francis, in the same font in which Saint Francis of Assisi had been baptised. Young Francis lost his mother when he was only four years old. He was educated by the Jesuits and, having been cured twice of serious illnesses, came to believe that God was calling him to the religious life. He wished to join the Jesuits but was turned down, probably because of his age, not yet 17. Following the death of a sister to cholera, his resolve to enter religious life became even stronger and he was accepted by the Passionists. Upon entering the novitiate he was given the name Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows.

Ever popular and cheerful, Gabriel quickly was successful in his effort to be faithful in little things. His spirit of prayer, love for the poor, consideration of the feelings of others, exact observance of the Passionist Rule as well as his bodily penances—always subject to the will of his wise superiors—made a deep impression on everyone.

His superiors had great expectations of Gabriel as he prepared for the priesthood, but after only four years of religious life symptoms of tuberculosis appeared. Ever obedient, he patiently bore the painful effects of the disease and the restrictions it required, seeking no special notice. He died peacefully on February 27, 1862, at age 24, having been an example to both young and old.

Saint Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows was beatified by Pope Pius X on May 31, 1908 and canonized by Pope Benedict XV in 1920. He is the patron saint of students, youth & clerics.

## FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

### “HOW THE ANTI-APOSTLE EFFECTIVELY BEGINS HIS WORK --- AND FEELS A VERY SPECIAL HATRED FOR THE CASSOCK”

This week, we continue our discussion of “Michael” the Communist anti-apostle who was one of many infiltrators with the intention to destroy the Church. Michael tells us:

In Rome, I had very interesting conversations with a professor who would be mine when I would have received the priesthood. He was a member of our network. (Meaning the Communistic network). He was very optimistic. He had specialized in Holy Scripture and was working at a new translation of the Bible in English. The most astounding thing was that he had chosen a Lutheran pastor as his only collaborator. The said pastor, besides, was no longer in agreement with his own church, which seemed old-fashioned to him.

This collaboration, of course, remained secret. The aim of these two men was to rid humanity of all the systems which had given itself through the Bible, and especially the New Testament. Thus, the virginity of Mary, the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and His Resurrection, according to them, were to be set aside, in order to end up with a complete suppression. The dignity of modern man, in their eyes, was worth such a price.

The professor also taught me a “reasonable” way to say Mass, since in six years I would be obliged to say it.

While waiting for a profound modification of the whole ceremony, he never pronounced the words of the Consecration. But so as not to be suspected, he pronounced words almost similar, at least according to the endings of the words. He advised me to do the same. All that made this ceremony look like a sacrifice, should, little by little, be suppressed. The whole ceremony should represent only a common meal, as among Protestants.

I believe the account above speaks well enough for itself. Even if you have concluded that the book “AA-1025” is a hoax, the events of the last 55 years or so have, in reality, been born out and have demonstrated these events completely.

Some time ago, I wrote several Reflections on the notion of the cassock and how its abandonment symbolized the setting aside of the true understanding of the priesthood, and therefore of the Mass and the Church itself. So says Anti-apostle Michael:

It is in Rome that I grasp the importance of the cassock, And I swore to myself that it would disappear from our streets and even our churches...I gained an ever-growing hatred for this piece of blackrag.
