



First Sunday in Lent

GOSPEL Matt. 4:1-11 At that time, Jesus was led by the spirit into the desert, to be tempted by the devil. And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterwards He was hungry. And the tempter coming said to Him: "If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread." Who answered and said: "It is written, Not by bread alone does man live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."

Then the devil took Him up into the holy city, and set Him upon the pinnacle of the temple, And said to Him: "If You are the Son of God, cast Yourself down, for it is written: That He hath given His angels charge over You, and in their hands shall they bear You up, lest perhaps You dash Your foot against a stone."

Jesus said to him: "It is written again: Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God."

Again, the devil took Him up into a very high mountain, and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world, and the glory of them, And said to Him: "All these things will I give You, if falling down You will adore me." Then Jesus said to him: "Begone, Satan: for it is written: The Lord thy God shalt thou adore, and Him only shalt thou serve."

Then the devil left Him; and behold angels came and ministered to Him.

We are told that angels have many roles. A few of them include being God's messengers and Holy warriors, watching history unfold, praising and worshipping God, and being Guardian Angels – protecting and directing people on God's behalf.

The Bible tells us that God's angels are delivering messages, accompanying the lonely, granting protection and even fighting His battles. Angels who were sent to deliver messages began by saying "Do not be afraid," or "Do not fear."



The Angel Gabriel is a messenger who was entrusted to deliver several important messages on God's behalf. Gabriel appears to at least three people in the Bible: first to the prophet Daniel ([Daniel 8:16](#)); next to the priest Zechariah to foretell and announce the miraculous birth of John the Baptist ([Luke 1:19](#)); and finally to the virgin Mary to tell her that she would conceive and bear a son ([Luke 1:26–38](#)).

Gabriel's name means "God is great," and, as the angel of the annunciation, he is the one who revealed that the Savior was to be called "Jesus" ([Luke 1:31](#))

In all three appearances, Gabriel was met with fear, and he had to begin his conversations with words of comfort and cheer for Daniel, Zechariah, and Mary. It is possible that Gabriel was also the angel that appeared to Joseph in [Matthew 1:20](#), but this is not certain, since that angel is unnamed in Scripture. What we do know is that Gabriel is one of God's good and holy angels. He has a favored position as an angel who "stands in the presence of God" ([Luke 1:19](#)), and he was selected to deliver important messages of God's particular love and favor to individuals chosen to be part of God's plan.

The Angel Gabriel or Saint Gabriel's feast day was exclusively celebrated the 18th of March according to many sources dating between the years 1588 and 1921. The feast was included for the first time in the General Roman Calendar in 1921, for celebration on March 24th.

Saint Gabriel is the patron saint of messengers, those who work for broadcasting and telecommunications such as radio and television, postal workers, clerics and diplomats.

FATHER SAFREED’S REFLECTIONS

THE PASSION OF THE CHURCH

It is customary, of course, to reflect upon the Passion of Christ during the Lenten Season. However, in this column for the next number of weeks, I plan to discuss the idea of the “Passion of the Church.” This concept may be new to you.

Catholic theology teaches us that the Church is the Mystical Body of Christ. Jesus Christ who now reigns in Heaven, once lived upon the Earth, and his salvific mission was not simply to the people of His time but was meant to extend to all people of all time. Thus, He lives MYSTICALLY through the Church, the True Church. Therefore Christ, the Savior, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity continues to Teach, Govern and Sanctify the faithful in the Church until He comes again in glory. Another way of saying this is that the Church is the extension of Christ and His mission in space and time. His intention is to save all men, not just those who lived 2000 years ago.

We see this understanding of the Church as Christ’s Mystical Body in the life of St. Paul. When Paul, who dedicated his life to persecuting Christians, traveling once on a mission from Jerusalem to Damascus, was struck blind by the appearance of the Resurrected Christ, Christ asked him, “Saul, Saul why are you persecuting ME?” Obviously, Christ was referring not to his own body, His physical person on earth, but to the Mystical Christ on earth, who lives in and through His Church.

It can also be said then that the Church has followed Our Lord Jesus Christ in the various stages of history:

....Mother Mary Potter, foundress of the Blue Nuns stated that “the Church, the Spouse of Jesus, seems to have followed the life of her Lord, and to have exemplified in herself various stages. There has been the Hidden Life of the early ages of the Church, followed by the more Public Life; then rose an increased devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, followed by the Agony in the Garden, and we seem now to be bordering on the times when the Church will mirage, will reflect, will in fact mystically reproduce the Crucifixion of her Divine Head and Master....the Church appears to be reaching the time when she will be mystically crucified with her Lord. The powers of darkness are evidently allowed a strange POWER of temptation: ‘It is their hour.’ Even many of our Lord’s own have fallen away. Throughout the Church there is unusual distress of soul and body.” [“The Passion of the Church” by Solange Strong Hertz, pp. 6-7.]

In the weeks that follow, I will be presenting reasons based on theology, the teaching and mind of the Church, and private revelation to support the thesis that we are living through the Mystical Passion of the Church, in similar manner that the Apostles and disciples lived through the historical passion of Christ over 2000 years ago. The purpose of these Reflections is to give us understanding, counsel and consolation.
