It is with great sadness and a heavy heart that we announce the death of Fr. Joseph F. Collins. Fr. Collins died April 27, at 11:54 am in Albany, New York, after a battle with cancer. For many years, he was the pastor at St. Michael Chapel & Shrine in Glenmont, New York. Originally ordained by Archbishop Marcel Lefebvre, Fr. Collins had been among the sedevacantist "Nine" who were expelled from the Society of St. Pius X in April of 1983, after they had sent a letter to Archbishop Lefebvre and the SSPX General Council concerning serious problems with regard to the SSPX's theology and internal policies. The other eight priests who also signed the letter were Fathers Clarence Kelly, Donald Sanborn, Daniel Dolan, Anthony Cekada, William Jenkins, Eugene Berry, Martin Skierka, and Thomas Zapp.

We thank Fr. Collins for his many years of working for the glory of God and the salvation of souls, and we pray that he will enjoy a happy eternity with God.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

WHAT'S WRONG WITH "DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY?"

This past Sunday the Traditional Church celebrated what has come to be known as "Low Sunday." "Low Sunday" is contrasted to the high point of the Church year which was the Feast of the Lord's Resurrection itself, or Easter Sunday. It has other names such as "Dominica in Albis in Octava Paschae," which is the official title given in the Roman Missal; "Sunday in White or White Sunday," indicating the fact that the newly baptized in the early Church still wore their white garment to the Liturgy. It is also referred to as "Quasimodo Sunday," which is the "incipit" or the beginning word of the Introit.

What this Sunday is not is "Divine Mercy Sunday." The cult of "Divine Mercy" which arose in Poland just before World War II, was condemned by the Church because it was suffused with the odor of heresy. In 1958 [the Holy Office] under Angelo Roncalli, [John XXIII] suppressed the cult outright. By 1978 the cult had resurfaced, now clothed with the heresies of ecumenism and universalism, or Universal Salvation. The "Divine Mercy" cult, TWICE condemned by the Church, has no basis in traditional Catholicism. The Octave Day of a Feast...in this case the Octave Day of Easter, is a significant day in itself. Dom Gueranger, the great Benedictine Scholar commented on this day..."Such is the solemnity of this Sunday that not only is it of Greater Double rite, but no feast, however great, can ever be kept upon it." The Octave Day of Easter is the feast that true Catholics keep. [Largely taken from the TRADITIO website, April 25, 2019]

The web-site "Novus Ordo Watch" comments:

True, the Holy Office at the time was under the ultimate supervision of Antipope John XXIII, but to keep things in perspective, he had been elected only 129 days prior, and the officials of the Holy Office had all been appointed by Pope Pius XII....[most notably] Cardinal Alfredo Ottaviani...in fact, it can be seen as even more damning an indictment of the "Divine Mercy" devotion that it was censured even under the Modernist Angelo Roncalli (John XXIII) the very originator of the Novus Ordo religion. The Novus Ordo church retained its ban on "Divine Mercy" for almost 20 years, until the efforts of Karol Wojtyła the future John Paul II desired not only to impose heresy but malign elements of Polish religiosity on the entire New Order church. [Oct. 20, 2013]

This "devotion" originates largely from Sister Faustina Kowalska who entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925. Soon after she was received into the convent, it is said she began to have alleged visions. However, Sister Faustina herself relates this incident:

"Fr. Bukowski came from Derdy. Some strange power pushed me to go to confession and tell him everything that had happened to me and about what Jesus said to me. When I told Father, he was quite different and he said to me...'What I said to you was said in warning, because illusions may afflict even holy persons, and Satan's insinuations may play a part in this, and sometimes this comes from our own selves, so one has to be careful.

But apparently, Sr. Kowalska pushed forward, and really did not listen to the Church. As one person on Twitter observed: "She could have been delivered from evil...and the rest of us spared from her false visions." Unfortunately, the Devil never sleeps, and can hide himself even under the mask of purported holiness.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
