



Extended Solemnity of the Sacred Heart

GOSPEL for the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus John 19:31-37 At that time, the Jews, since it was the day of Preparation, in order that the bodies would not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), asked Pilate that their legs might be broken and that they might be taken away. The soldiers came and broke the legs of the first, and of the other who had been crucified with Him. But when they came to Jesus and saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. And he who saw it has borne witness--his testimony is true, and he knows that he is telling the truth--that you also may believe. For these things took place that the Scripture might be fulfilled: "Not one of His bones will be broken." And again another Scripture says, "They will look on Him whom they have pierced."

On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts. Peter & Paul. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord. He was the first to recognize that Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the living God," and eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. In his boldness, he also made many mistakes, however, such as losing faith when walking on water with Christ and betraying the Lord on the night of His passion. Yet despite his human weaknesses, Peter was chosen to shepherd God's flock.

St. Peter spent his last years in Rome, leading the Church through persecution and eventually being martyred in the year 64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request, because he claimed he was not worthy to die as his Lord. He was buried on Vatican hill, and St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church. Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Scripture records that Saul was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen.

Saul's conversion took place as he was on his way to Damascus to persecute the Christian community there. As he was traveling along the road, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light from heaven. He was blinded and fell off his horse. He then heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He answered: "Who are you, Lord?" Christ said: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting." Saul continued to Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles of the Mediterranean world.

Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome, where he was beheaded in the year 67. He is buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

PAUL VI THE NEW MASS AND THE NEW RELIGION

For centuries when popes appeared on the balcony of St. Peter's after having been elected, they donned the papal mozzetta. One rendering of this cape-like garment is worn in cooler temperatures and its composition consists in material of deep red velvet garnished with ermine trim. The mozzetta was one of many symbols indicating the authority of popes — along with a heavily embroidered stole that is often placed over it. Francis refused to wear this garment when he emerged on the balcony, manifesting in a symbolic manner his rejection of true papal authority.

Antipope Paul VI [1963-1978] often donned the mozzetta, however the symbol he added to the papal ensemble indicates a sinister agenda:

What is that which we discover on Paul VI's chest over his pectoral cross?
It is a curious jewel that I don't seem to remember ever being worn by any Pope.
The object is made out of gold, square, decorated with twelve precious stones set in four rows of three each. It hangs in a very peculiar way, from a gold cord which ties around his neck and is next to the Cross of Christ...
this appears to be the object we read about in the 28th book of Exodus...in this Paul VI was wearing the Ephod, the insignia of the Jewish high priest Caiaphas.

Caiaphas, you will remember was the high priest who condemned Our Lord Jesus Christ to death. He was undoubtedly wearing this garment which was also known as "the breastplate of judgement" when sentencing Christ to be crucified as a malefactor.

Paul VI knows very well what his "Breastplate of judgment" the Ephod signifies; he knows its origins in the ritualistic dress of the Ancient Covenant (that is the Old Testament), he is not ignorant of the fact that Masons today use it as a distinctive mark of their high priest.

In 1965 when officiating at a United Function at the United Nations, Paul VI wore the Breastplate of Caiaphas...the breastplate worn by the High Priest who condemned Christ to death in the middle-of-the-night trial, which took place right after Judas betrayed Christ with a kiss in the Garden of Gethsemane, and right before Caiaphas ordered that Christ be taken to Pontius Pilate...
this UN address can be seen as Paul VI's veiled communication to his brother conspirators around the world that it was time to rejoice.

Among other very wicked things, Paul VI put to death the Kingship of Christ in the world by his speech and presence at the United Nations. Furthermore, he invalidated the real and true re-enactment of the Sacrifice of Christ in the Mass with the promulgation of the Novus Ordo Missae. In this manner he was following in the footsteps of Caiaphas, who put Our Lord Jesus Christ to death in the flesh 2000 years ago. Thus, the symbol of the Ephod.
