GOSPEL Luke 16: 1-9 At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: "There was a certain rich man, who had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he was wasting his goods. And he called him, and said to him, 'What is this that I hear of thee? render the account of thy stewardship; for thou canst be no longer steward.' "And the steward said within himself, 'What shall I do, seeing that my lord taketh away the stewardship from me? I have not strength to dig; to beg I am ashamed. I am resolved what to do, that, when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses.' And calling to him each one of his lord's debtors, he said to the first, 'How much owest thou unto my lord?' And he said, 'A hundred measures of oil.' And he said unto him, 'Take thy bond, and sit down quickly and write fifty.' Then said he to another, 'And how much owest thou?' And he said, 'A hundred measures of wheat.' He saith unto him, 'Take thy bond, and write fourscore.' "And his lord commended the unrighteous steward because he had done wisely: for the sons of this world are for their own generation wiser than the sons of the light. And I say unto you, make to yourselves friends by means of the mammon of unrighteousness; that, when it shall fail, they may receive you into the eternal tabernacles."

Truth was St. Dominic's motto and his goal. He was born in Spain, (8 August 1170 – 6 August 1221) the youngest of four children. He was educated by his uncle, a priest. St. Dominic became a priest and joined a religious community. Soon he became the prior, or head.

St. Dominic might have lived his whole life in that monastery if he had not gone with his bishop to northern Europe in 1204. As they traveled, St. Dominic saw that many people were following heretics, or false teachers. St. Dominic, his bishop, and three Cistercian monks went from city to city preaching the truth of Christ, using the Bible. They went on foot, depending on others for food and a place to sleep.

Soon people returned to the faith—not only because of what these preachers said, but because of how they lived.

By 1215 a few men had joined St. Dominic in his work of preaching. He founded the Order of Preachers, better known as the Dominicans. He urged his members to study and to pray. Then they would be ready to preach. St. Dominic realized that to be true witnesses of the Gospel, Dominicans could not be wealthy. His followers also deeply loved the Blessed Virgin Mary and spread devotion to her through the rosary.

St. Dominic's community was different from most because his friars traveled and preached instead of staying in their monastery. His order tried to reach the well-educated who were deceived by heresy, while the Franciscans went to the poor and uneducated.

St. Dominic fell ill with fever while he was on a preaching mission through northern Italy, he died, only six years after he had founded his community.

St. Dominic was able to draw the members of this community together and inspire them to love and forgive one another. He was outstanding for his love of truth, his clear thought, his organizing ability, and his sensitive, loving nature. For St. Dominic, love for people was part of his love for God.

Under the authority of Pope Gregory IX, Dominic was canonized in 1234. and his feast day is August 4. St. Dominic is the patron saint of astronomers, the Dominican Republic, and the innocent who are falsely accused of crimes. He is commonly depicted in icons with a dog, or lilies, holding a book.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

A UNIVERSAL TRAGEDY AND ANTICHRIST

I am old enough to remember the “tail-end” of the Church before Vatican II. It’s virtually impossible to explain to people even five years younger than myself what a totally different world it was. Personally speaking, I remember my parents who first handed on the Faith to me, as being very pious, even holy people, who along with other Catholic relatives were happy in the Church that seemed so secure and solid. My mother, who’s Missal she received as a gift on her wedding day, was well worn by the time I was born — the Ordinary of the Mass being repaired and taped over many times — manifesting a profound belief in the Sacrifice of the Mass. Obviously, the Faith meant a great deal to both my father and mother. However, by 1980 or so, it had become apparent to me that my parents had lost their faith, and it was also apparent that this occurred because of Vatican II. They were not alone.

A UNIVERSAL AND TRAGIC LOSS OF FAITH

How could so many people lose their faith after Vatican II? It has happened before. Noe and seven others remained faithful to God while the rest of the world perished in the flood. Only a handful of His followers remained faithful to Our Lord as He hung on the Cross.

Many in Palestine rejected Jesus Christ around the year 33 AD.

Many in the Middle East left the Church and became Islamic by the year 630.

Many in Asia and Europe left the Church and became Orthodox in the year 1054.

Many in Europe left the Church and became Protestant by the year 1517.

Many throughout the world left the Church and became Modernist by the year 1970.
[Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism, p. 741]

This Modernist revolution could be described as a “silent apostasy,” for it occurred very much in a “frog in the pot” fashion that slowly and unwittingly kills an amphibian creature as the temperature rises. The same can be said for many people after Vatican II, as the faith was slowly but undoubtedly extinguished in millions of souls.

We are, almost without doubt, living through what St. Paul under the Inspiration of the Holy Ghost called “The Great Apostasy.” Our Lord Jesus Christ also prophetically spoke of this reality in the Gospel:

Yet when the Son of Man comes, will he find, do you think, faith on earth? (Luke 18:8)

Let no one deceive you in any way, for the day of the Lord will not come unless the **apostasy** comes first and the **man of sin** revealed, the son of perdition. (2 Thessalonians 2,3-4)

Throughout the ages many have speculated about this “man of sin” St. Paul speaks of whose other titles include the name of “Antichrist.” The universal tragedy spoken of here is most certainly of Antichrist, Christ’s ultimate adversary.

DRESS POLICY




